Reproductive genetic counseling

Genetic information and knowledge is changing rapidly. Understanding your genetic testing choices can be complicated, so it is important to have a trusted source for gaining answers to your questions.

Our genetic counselors work with you and your health care provider to help you understand your genetic risks and testing options. You may meet with a genetic counselor when you are considering genetic testing, or to discuss the results of genetic testing.

What is a genetic counselor?

A genetic counselor is a **health care professional** specifically trained in medical genetics and counseling who can help you understand if you have an increased chance of having a child with a birth defect or genetic disorder. Genetic counselors are **experts** at evaluating your **personal** medical and family history, identifying your genetic risks, and helping you understand the tests available to you.

At Integrated Genetics, we have a network of approximately 100 board-certified and state-licensed genetic counselors covering all 50 states and are invested in the health of you and your family. Our commitments to you are three-fold

What happens during a genetic counseling session?

Every consultation is different based on the individual needs or concerns of you and your family. In certain situations our genetic counselors will meet with you prior to genetic testing to help you understand your options.

If you have already received genetic testing, your health care provider may recommend genetic results counseling or a comprehensive genetic counseling session with Integrated Genetics to explain your test results and help you chart a course for how to use this knowledge. Our genetic counselors will guide and advocate for you as you navigate through potentially emotional or difficult information.

Who should consider genetic counseling with Integrated Genetics?



Individuals who may have reproductive concerns



A woman who will be 35 years or older when baby is born



Anyone with an abnormal genetic test result, positive screening, or abnormal ultrasound during pregnancy



Anyone with a family history of disease or condition (e.g. cystic fibrosis, spinal muscular atrophy), birth defects or intellectual disability that may run in the family



Couples with infertility thought to have a genetic cause, or two or more pregnancy losses

Planning for your session

- Gather medical history information about your family members, including parents, siblings, aunts, uncles, grandparents and cousins. Ask family members about genetic conditions (e.g. cystic fibrosis, spinal muscular atrophy), birth defects and intellectual disabilities
- Collect records of any genetic testing you may have had in the past to bring with you
- You may want to include your reproductive partner in the genetic counseling appointment to allow your genetic counselor to review medical history from both sides of your family and discuss relevant testing
